

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Language:

JWT allows British or American English (please use consistently throughout the manuscript).

Layout and Content:

Research Article/ Short Communication / Review Article shall contain the following headings:

1. Title: This should reflect the content of the manuscript and should be concise.
2. Authors: Please provide the first and last names of all authors along with their affiliations and the complete mailing address (postal codes and country), phone (including country code and area code), and email address. If the first author is not the corresponding author, identify the corresponding author with an asterisk.
3. Abstract: A maximum of 250 words
4. Key words: A maximum of five words (not already included in the title).
5. **INTRODUCTION:** Should be a concise introduction to the research questions and may include hypothesis and predictions (if applicable) as well as significance. Avoid beginning with your study species.
6. **MATERIALS AND METHODS:** Must be complete and include dates and duration (and intensity) of the study, study location, research design, programs used and data analysis.
7. **RESULTS**
8. **DISCUSSION**
9. **CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION** (optional)
10. **ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS** (optional)
11. **REFERENCES** (see below for formatting guidelines)
12. **APPENDICES** (optional)

Manuscripts should be written double-spaced on letter or A4 size in a WORD document. Font size must be at least 11 points Times New Roman. Please place figures and tables (including captions) within the text **after** they have been mentioned for the first time.

Text should be aligned left; footnotes should be avoided; all units of measurement should be in metric, or preferably SI units; all pages should be numbered; Tables and Figures should be numbered and captioned. All abbreviations need to be explained the first time they are used.

Citation:

Reference citation in the text should have the following formats. In case of multiple citations, the references should be cited in chronological order. In case of more than one publication within the same year, references should be sorted alphabetically.

2. (Ulber 1993; Chuaynkern *et al.* 2005; Nabhitabhata & Chanard 2005)
